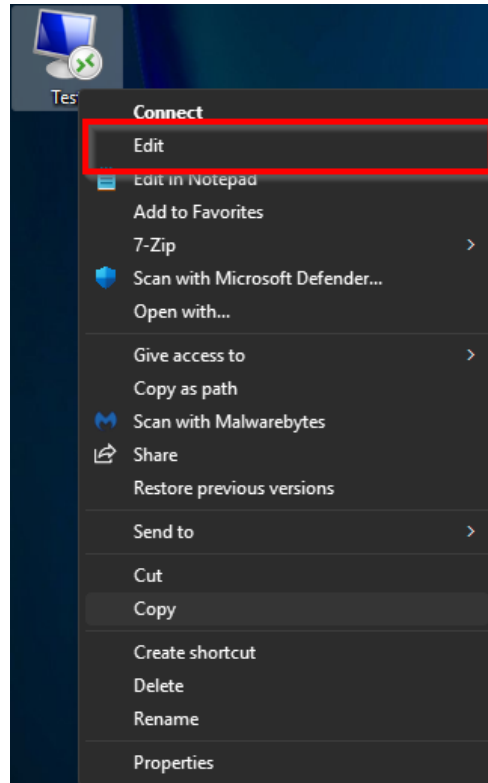
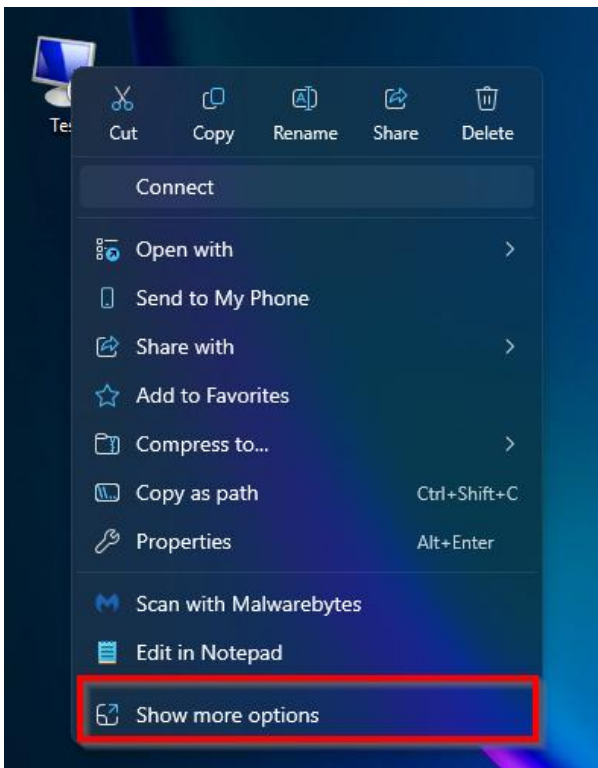


Step 1 - Locate Your Existing RDP File

- Find the .rdp shortcut you normally use to connect.
- This may be on your Desktop, in Documents, or in a custom folder.

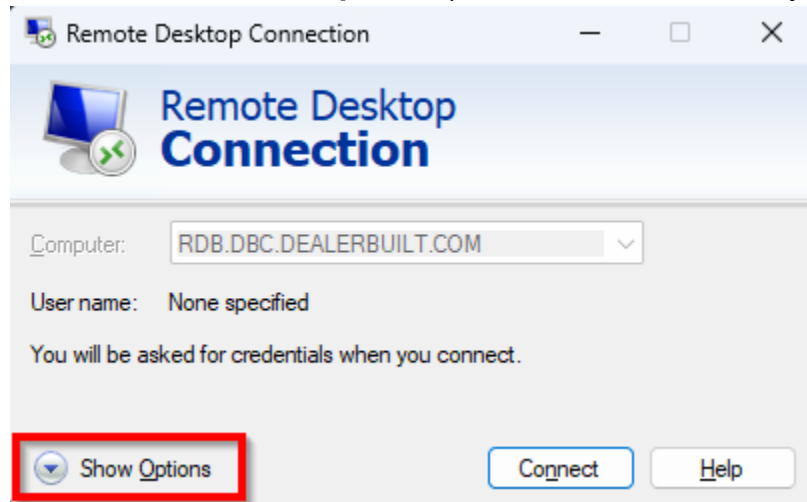

1. Right-click the .rdp file.
2. Click **Show more options**.
3. Click **Edit**.

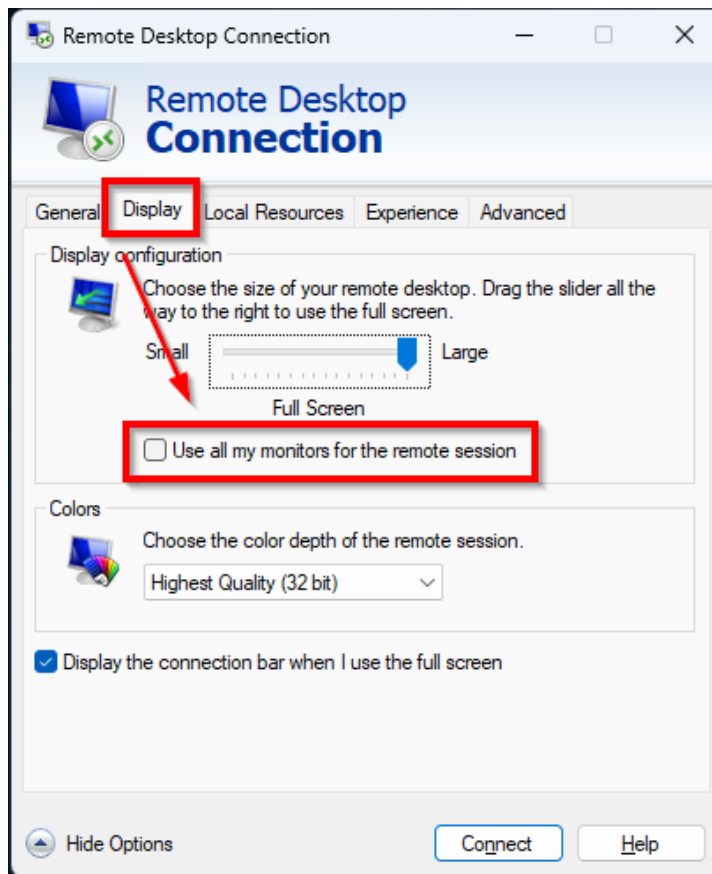


Step 3 — Enable Multi-Monitor Mode (GUI Method)

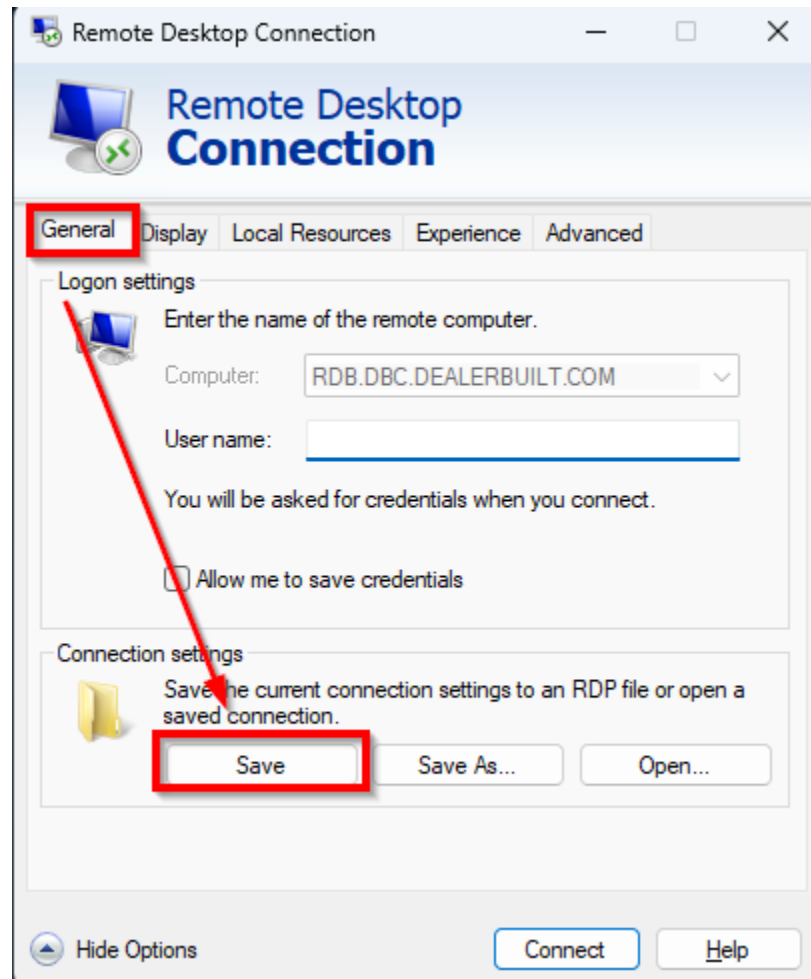
1. In the RDC window, click **Show Options** (bottom left, if not already expanded).



2. Select the **Display** tab.
3. Check the box **Use all my monitors for the remote session**.



4. Click **Save** to update the existing .rdp file.



Step 5 — Apply Changes and Launch

1. After saving your changes, close out of any open Remote Desktop windows.
2. Relaunch the .rdp file by double-clicking it.
3. The remote desktop should now display across your other screens using multi-monitor mode.
